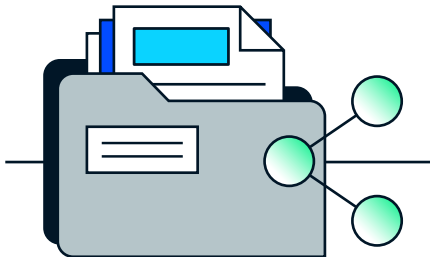

Data sharing



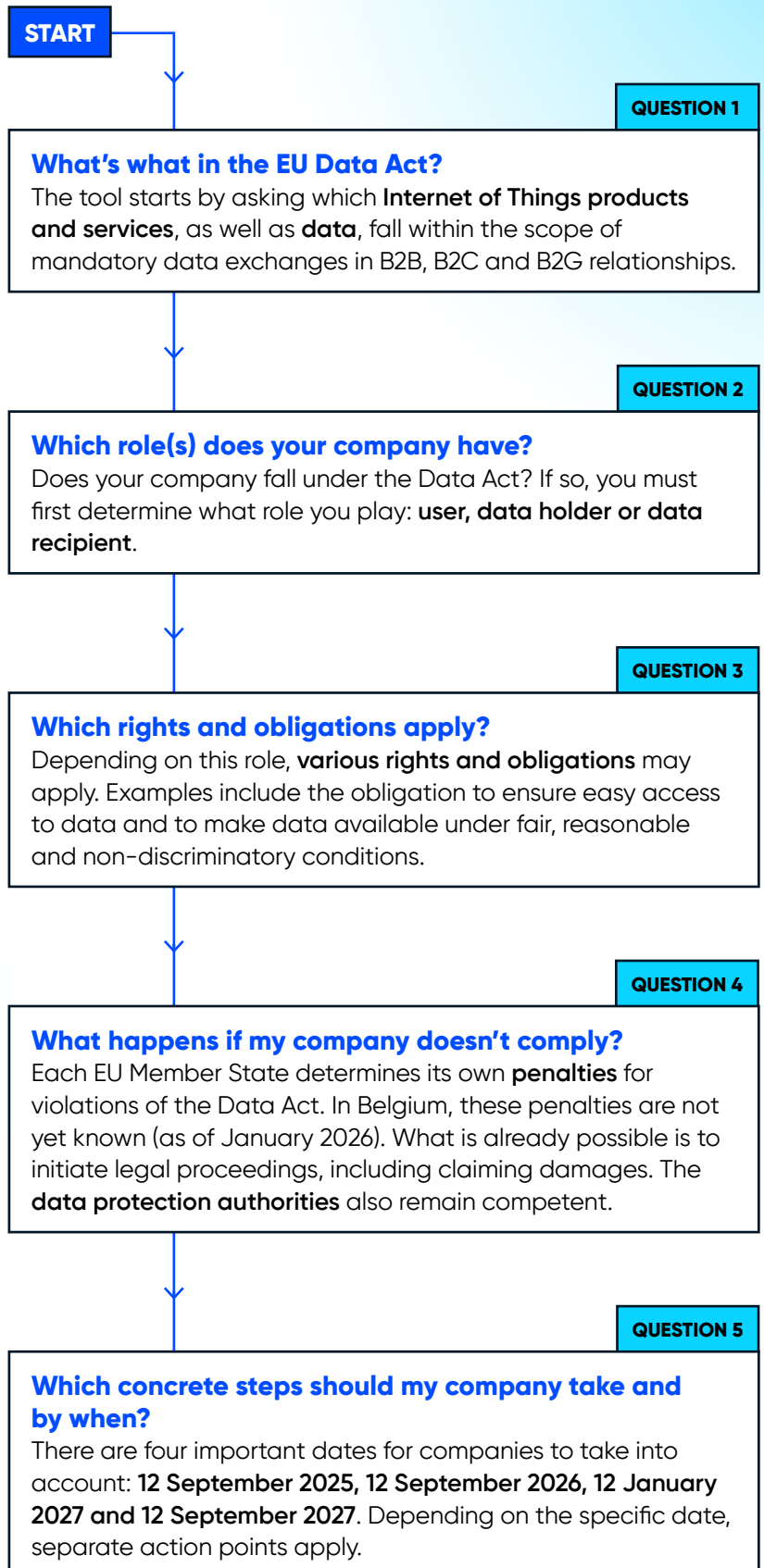
The EU Data Act requires companies to share certain data with consumers, other companies or public actors.
